



## US-Africa Summit



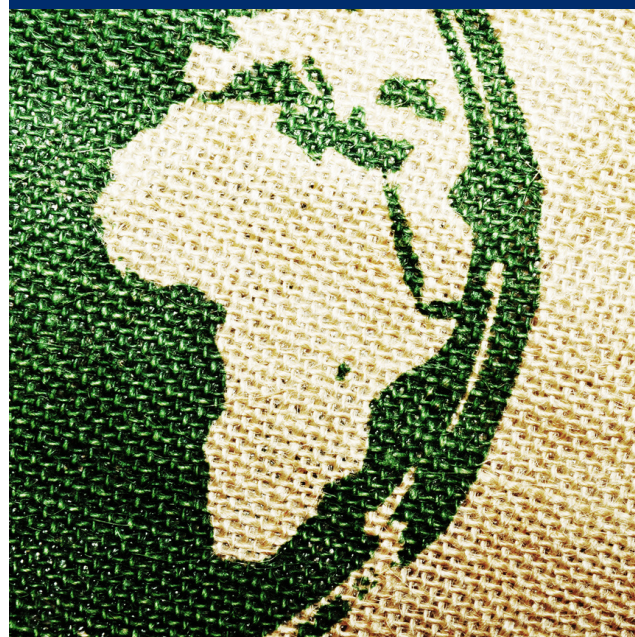
